Notice of Termination for City of Columbia MS4 – SCS790001 Grading Permits and Land Disturbing Activities Associated with Construction

The two procedures outlined below should be utilized for the submittal of Notices of Termination (NOT) for SCS790001 to the City. The completed, signed, original NOT form should be mailed to the following address:

- 1) **Sites that are one acre and above of total land disturbance** should submit the following form: http://www.epa.gov/npdes/pubs/cgp_appendixf.pdf. If submission of as-built drawings of Stormwater management structures was required in the approval letter for the site's NPDES coverage, then this should be submitted to the City and accepted by the City prior to the NOT being processed.

In addition to this form, from Section 5.2 of the 2006 CGP requires that an engineering certification be provided **for sites that disturb more than 2 acres**. Following is the exact section outlining what is required:

"For Projects disturbing more than 2 acres, a certification statement, signed and dated by the preparer of the SWPPP or other person with a registration equivalent to that of the preparer of the SWPPP, that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief all work was conducted and completed in accordance with the approved SWPPP and this CGP. This certification must be based on the inspections performed in accordance with this Subpart 3.10 of this CGP and must state that any deficiencies that were noted have been corrected."

- 2) **Sites that are between 5,000 square feet and 1 acre of total land disturbance** should submit the following form: <http://www.columbiasc.net/stormwater>
 - Stormwater Regulations/Permitting
 - Land Disturbance Documents

If submission of as-built drawings of Stormwater management structures was required in the approval letter for the site's NPDES coverage, then this should be submitted to the City and accepted by the City prior to the NOT being processed.
